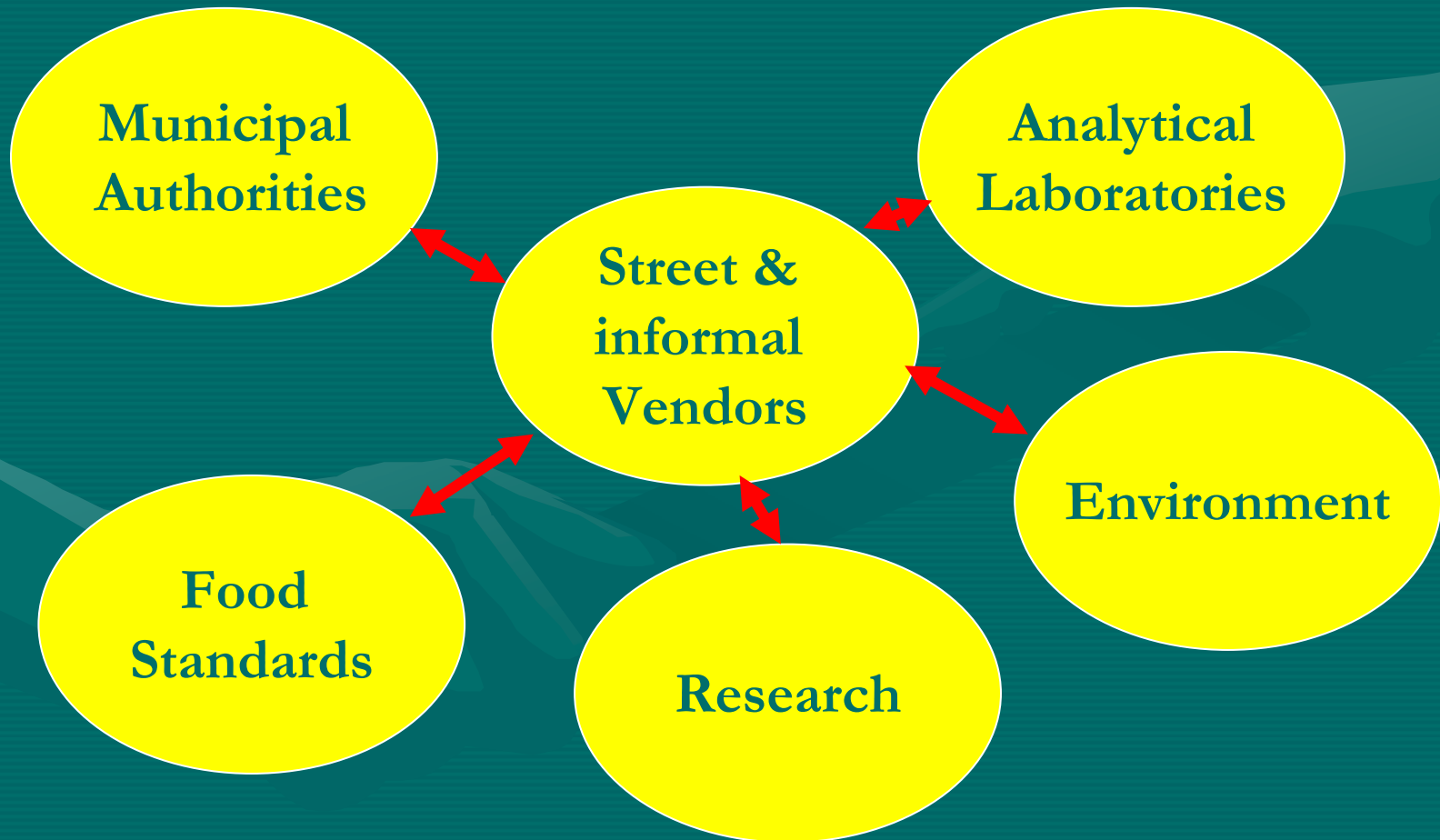

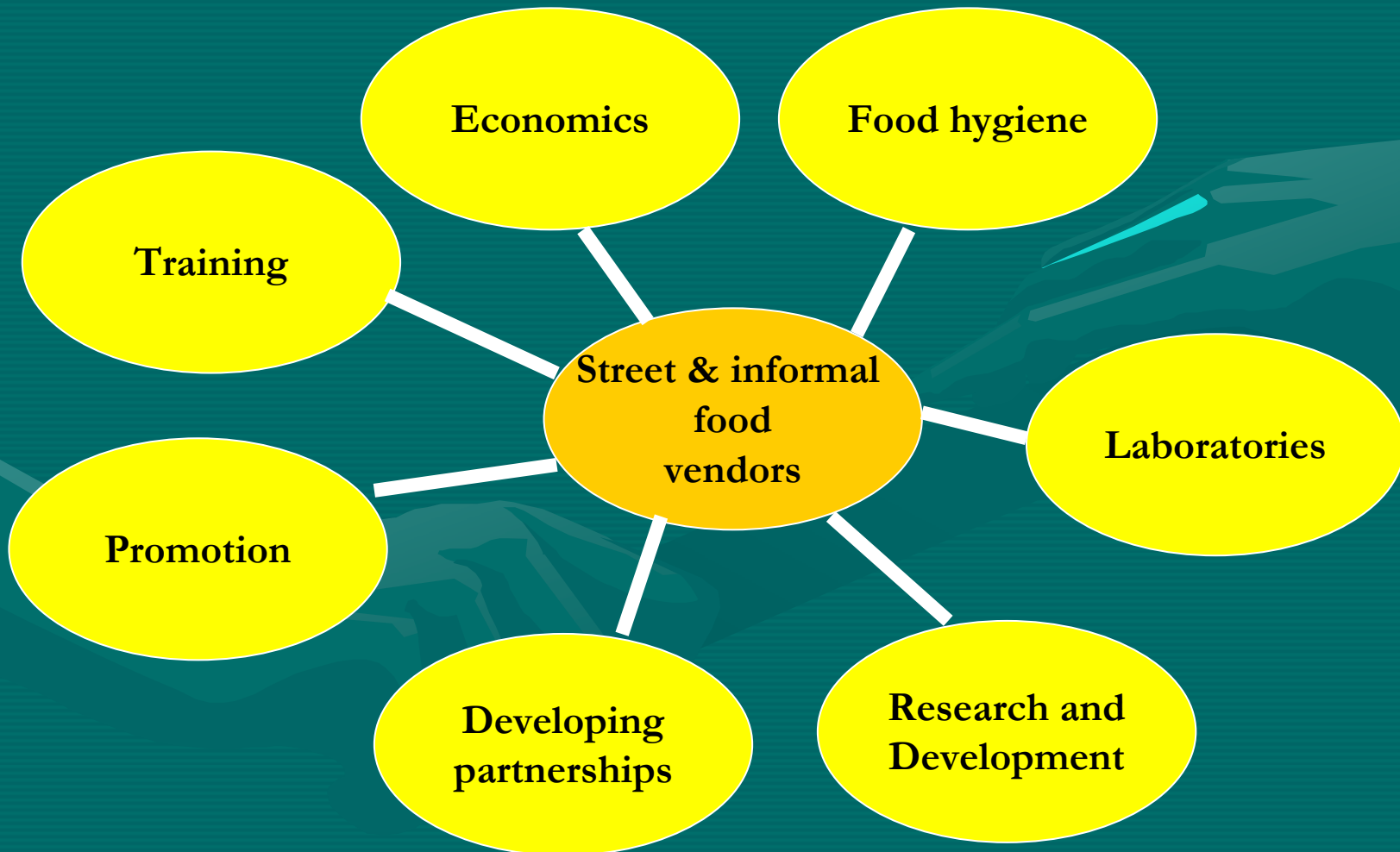


# Partnerships

# Why develop modules?

- The partnership approach has been very successful in Ghana, Zambia and Zimbabwe. A new partnership will be developed in India;
- Earlier projects have developed lots of new knowledge and ideas but these were not structured;
- Project will use a systems approach to bring our results and ideas into a series of modules so that other towns and cities in world can copy our approach;
- Other cities and towns will select the modules most suitable for them.

# How will the modules be used?

- Each module will be a guide for other partnerships;
- Will be a source of knowledge and experiences;
- May help to save other groups time and money;
- Contribute to improving livelihoods of street / informal food vendors and consumer health.

# Activities in each country – Phase I

- Develop modules based on experiences on street foods in each of Ghana, Zambia and Zimbabwe;
- Each country will test some of the modules (for example training and promotion).
